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

DICK BREMER

The 2018 season marked Dick Bremer's 35th season as a broadcaster for the Minnesota Twins. The Minnesota native graduated from St. Cloud State University in 1978. Following his graduation he worked for three years in Cedar Rapids, IA as a sportscaster for WMT-Radio and TV (now KGAN-TV). While there, he began his play-byplay career broadcasting University of Iowa basketball.

He was named weekend sportscaster at WTCN-TV (now KARE 11) in 1981. After two years, he left to begin his Twins play-by-play career with Spectrum Sports in 1983. He remained there until 1985 while also doing Minnesota North Stars games. He rejoined the Twins broadcast team in 1987 and has remained there working for Twinsvision, Midwest Sports Channel and FS North.

In 2013, Dick was the recipient of the Silver Circle Emmy for Broadcast Excellence and inducted into the Minnesota Museum of Broadcasting Hall of Fame.

Throughout his career, he has done broadcasting for Minnesota Vikings preseason football, University of Minnesota men's hockey, football and basketball, Big Ten basketball, and the Minnesota State High School League's football and girls' and boys' basketball tournaments.

Dick and his wife, Heidi, along with son Erik and daughter Hannah, make their home in St. Michael, MN.

During his retirement years, Harmon Killebrew was a spokesperson for the hospice movement and embraced the role it plays at one of the most critical times we face in life. In 2013, Harmon's family and friends created the Harmon Killebrew Hospice Home for Kids Fund to support Crescent Cove. In 2018, the Board of Directors at Crescent Cove approved the fund to become an endowment fund, ensuring funding into the future.

HARMON AND HOSPICE

Harmon experienced the value of hospice care himself. After two neardeath experiences, he found his calling to support hospice care. He also saw the need for a special hospice and respite care home for children. He and his wife, Nita, were involved in early efforts to create a children's hospice in the 1990s, and he frequently made hospice and hospital visits. Harmon was passionate about the value of hospice care and thought that building this home was as important as any of his legendary baseball achievements.

Jo and Toby Schifsky already had three beautiful children when they discovered they were pregnant with their fourth. They were thrilled to be sharing this experience with their oldest children, Roman, Lily and Simone, who accompanied them to the 20-week ultrasound to see and hear their new sibling.

What they expected to be a joyous time of discovery took a turn when the technician became silent. They left the appointment knowing that something was wrong, but not having answers as to what. Eventually the answer came by way of a long word, Holoprosencephaly (HPE), a disorder in which the brain fails to develop into two separate hemispheres in utero. They were devastated to be told that their child had a 3 percent chance of surviving delivery; of those who do, only 1 percent of these children live beyond 6 months of age.

Charlie came into the world quickly the day after Thanksgiving, and, despite her odds, survived the delivery. She was born breathing on her own, and came home 2 days later. As a precaution she was on hospice care, but at 5 months of age she was discharged from the program because she was doing better than the doctors expected. Charlie has defied the odds and, at age 7, has become the social center of the family.

"Our older children are changed because of Charlie," Toby says, "and in wonderful, compassionate ways." Jo had heard about Crescent Cove before having Charlie. "At the time I was grateful it was there for families who needed it, never having an idea that we would become one of those families," she says.

Toby and Jo have utilized Crescent Cove's services to keep connected as a family and take much-needed breaks from the complex care they provide to Charlie. From outings for the older siblings to overnight stays at Crescent Cove's facility, being a part of the Crescent Cove community has helped them grow together as a couple and a family.

"Building relationships with other families who have been down a similar road has been incredible for us," says Jo, "Every day with Charlie could be our last. Other people don't like to talk about it, but at Crescent Cove, it's a safe place to share those emotions."

"Providing complex care is overwhelming," says Toby, "Crescent Cove not only gives us an opportunity to step away to catch our breath, but also brings more people onto our team. That is truly a priceless gift."
